- 10.30 a.m. Flags at half-mast.
- 10.33 a.m. The Shrine Guard in position.
- 10.35 a.m. Selection by the Victorian Public Service Band.
- 10.39 a.m. Arrival at Southern approach of the Federal President of the Returned Sailors, Soldiers, and Airmen's Imperial League of Australia and the President of the Victorian Branch, who enter the Inner Sanctuary of the Shrine and place wreaths on the Rock of Remembrance.
- 10.42 a.m. Arrival of the Right Honorable the Lord Mayor of Melbourne, who enters the Inner Shrine and places wreath on the Rock of Remembrance.
- 10.45 a.m. Arrival of the Honorable the Premier, who enters the Inner Shrine and places wreath on Rock of Remembrance.
- 10.48 a.m. Arrival of the Right Honorable the Prime Minister, who enters the Inner Shrine and places wreath on Rock of Remembrance.
- 10.51 a.m. Guard Slopes Arms.
- 10.52 a.m. Arrival of His Excellency the Governor-Royal Salute-Guard Slopes Arms, Orders Arms, and Unfixes Bayonets.

- 10.58 a.m. His Excellency the Governor and Party enter the Inner Sanctuary of the Shrine and remain facing the Rock of Remembrance.
- 10.58¹/₂ a.m. Guard rests on arms reversed.


(Men not in uniform remove head-dress)

- 10.59¹/₄ a.m. Siren sounds one long blast (10 seconds), followed by one short blast. Buglers sound "Still."
- 11.0 a.m. Gun fires. Immediately gun is fired His Excellency the Governor places wreath on the Rock of Remembrance.

Two minutes' Silence.

- 11.2 a.m. Short blast of Siren, followed immediately by gun fire. Buglers sound "Carry On."
 - His Excellency the Governor and Party emerge from the Inner Shrine. Guard Slopes Arms, Orders Arms, and Fixes Bayonets. Buglers sound the Last Post.
- 11.5 a.m. Guard Slopes Arms. Trumpeters sound the "Reveille." Flags at Mast-Head. (On headdress.)
- 11.5¹/₂ a.m. Guard Presents Arms. National Anthem; sung by public, accompanied by Band. Guard Slopes Arms, Orders Arms.
- 11.8 a.m. His Excellency the Governor departs.

At the conclusion of the Service the general public will be permitted to pass through the Inner Sanctuary of the Shrine, when those desirous of doing so may place wreaths on the Rock of Remembrance.

ARMISTICE DAY - THURSDAY, 11th NOVEMBER, 1943.
