





If you are searching for a house which is different from anything else in the world, start thinking along tram lines.

Soon after that a cou-ple called Hollinger bought the property. Mrs Hollinger sold it to Rolf Herweg in 1977.

Mr Herweg, a fitter, redesigned the house and a friend helped with renovations.

Mr Herweg, born in Cologne, West Germany, said he had to stay in his room most of the time when he was young.

Imaginative use of three solid wooden trams has created a unique home.

It has a protruding circular entrance made of doors from an old church. Behind that is an entrance hall and timber spiral staircase leading to a reading alcove overlooking the main lounge.

Home built from trams

Around about 1910, Melbourne's tramway system was transformed with the introduction of electricity, and the first four-wheeler electric trams began to run through our inner-suburban streets.

Some 70 years have elapsed since those early Edwardian days, which no doubt bring nostalgic memories of their school days to those octogenarians still living.

Most of those trams have vanished into the dust of history. But not all! In the 1920s, trams Nos 1, 5 and 6 from this early era were pensioned off to become hideaway hillside retreats in the Dandenongs.

Those particular three trams have not been allowed to rot away, but have been joined into a remarkable home at 18 School Road Ferny Creek.

They have been restored in meticulous detail, with all their original brasswork, solid oak frames, walnut panelling, and even em-

bellished in classical maroon and gold external livery.

Arranged in U-shape formation, they have been integrated as one dwelling, with an impressive central living area under high vaulted and arched timbers.

Pergola

The resulting floorplan also provides for a small sunroom opening through to a delightful rotunda style pergola with extensive brick paving for outdoor living.

There is also a delightful study, while the centre of one tram forms an exquisite dining room, with widened bar-styled window ledges through to the central living area, and well equipped kitchen nearby.

The centres of two other trams are used as two intriguing bedrooms, large enough to accommodate a double bed and fitted out with built in robes. The floor plan is completed by a cute bathroom plus separate shower and separate toilet.

Spiral

There is also a walk through to an attached conservatory at the rear, while the wide curving entrance foyer has a spiral staircase winding up to a small mezzanine relaxation library area, which captures distant views across to the Cardinia Reservoir.

Purchasers of this property will buy an irreplaceable piece of Melbourne's history which will be a talking point and envy of their friends for years to come.

The house is built on land measuring 66' x 160' and has a foundation of brick pillars and stumps, which gives it the potential to be moved to another

site.
