Manual handling

Manual handling is defined as any type of work that involves the use of force to lift, lower, push, pull, carry, move, hold or restrain objects.

Manual handling is one of the biggest causes of workplace injuries in Victoria, so we all need to be conscious of the proper procedures.

Injuries don't just occur in complex construction and warehouse type environments, but can also happen in operational and office type workplaces.

So regardless of whether you are filing a pile of heavy records, moving some computer hardware or lifting a heavy tram part or piece of machinery remember to:

- Use mechanical aids if available (i.e.lifts, jacks or trolleys)
- Ensure the work environment is clear of slip, trip and fall hazards
- Seek the help of a work colleague when moving heavy or awkward items
- Take regular breaks from repetitive manual handling tasks

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More Melburnians now understand the need for greater tram priority on our roads, thanks to some major media coverage.

- The issue made news ahead of the Easter break when The Age ran a front page story about a Yarra Trams study into tram priority.
- Several radio stations also reported on the decline in tram speed amid the growing congestion on Melbourne's roads. The Yarra Trams study made three key recommendations to improve the speed and reliability of the network:
- Dynamic priority for trams on Swanston Street (traffic light priority for trams when they need it)
- More green time for east-west tram movements in the CBD, particularly at King Street
- Further work on providing dynamic priority for trams across the Yarra Trams network
- On the same day, The Australian Financial Review reported on the business boom in the Docklands area, leading to a massive increase in tram patronage along Collins Street. The story recognised that trams have become the new cabs for many in the corporate world.
- To cap off a busy day in the headlines, the Herald Sun reported on the Spencer Street works over the Easter / ANZAC Day long weekend and publicised our offer of earplugs for the aural relief of local residents and traders.
- On the local front, the Yarra Plenty Regional Library website featured a large photo of the "tram face" it purchased through our Good Friday Appeal fundraiser.

We renewed 740 metres of double track on Spencer Street as well as the curves from Spencer into Collins and Bourke Streets. At the same time, we helped passengers onto diverted tram services and tram replacement buses. Thank you for a great team effort.



We presented a cheque for \$68,422.50 to the Good Friday Appeal and raised another \$5758 selling tramburgers and Yarra Trams merchandise.
