

Your ideas into action!

Six ideas from employees are being turned into reality thanks to our Performance Improvement Fund.

The PIF committee gave the nod to the ideas at its first meeting and wants to thank everyone who submitted suggestions.

Four suggestions for safety equipment came from staff in the Rolling Stock department. Jamie Russell of Preston Workshops proposed equipment for bogie axle and wheel stands, Reza Naghavi of Southbank asked for capacitor discharge units and Jim Tennant of Brunswick suggested a storage cabinet for flammable chemicals.

Endorsed proposals also came from Amar Shah in IT for a hydraulic trolley to carry heavy equipment and from Steve Roberts at Head Office for safety mirrors.

The fund has been established to give employees the chance to see their suggestions transformed into workplace enhancements. Ideas can be submitted on a PIF form, available at your location, and will be reviewed by managers before going before the committee. A budget of \$200,000 has been allocated for turning good ideas into reality.

Five ideas were referred back to the person who made the suggestion for further information and will be discussed again at a future meeting.

The committee will meet again on 8 April and there's still money left in the budget, so make sure you pick up a form and get your good idea in as soon as possible.

Spencer Street works update

Preparations for the major works on Spencer Street over the Easter holidays are in full swing.

The project involves overhead work and track renewal, as well as maintenance on the Clarendon Street bridge.

Metro Trains will be doing works between Flinders Street and Southern Cross Station at the same time, to minimise disruption to local businesses and residents. The two public transport operators teamed up to present a community information session on Wednesday 16 March.

Yarra Trams staff from Infrastructure, Communications and Marketing as well as Traffic Management contractors and Metro's representatives discussed the project with locals.

The works will have a major impact on services.

Further details will be posted at affected depots closer to the start of the project.

Did You Know?

The fifth and final *Did You Know?* passenger information card is on board trams and it's a big hit.

Unlike the third card in the series which gave its message in the form of a "smash hit" record, this time passengers are reminded what the consequences of a 'big hit' from a tram can be. It urges them to be

One tram weighs roughly the same as 30 rhinoceroses and the message is that you'd stop and pay attention if you saw 30 rhinos coming down the street on skateboards so why wouldn't you do the same for a tram?

It also explains the consequences of a quick stop on passengers inside the tram and the potential for falls.

The message about avoiding distractions around trams is also relevant to staff, in line with our *Zero Harm* policy.
