TRAMS on PARADE

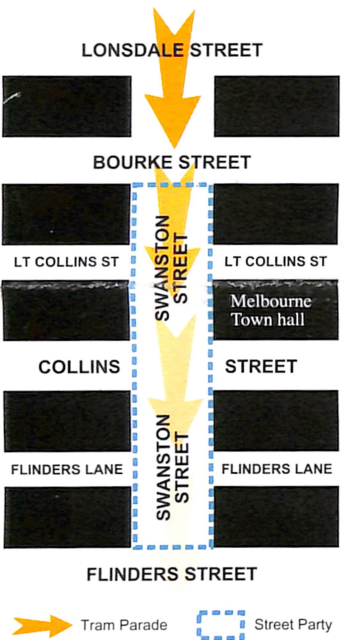

Swanston Street, Melbourne (between Flinders and Lonsdale Streets)

Labour Day in Melbourne will see the return of a Moomba tradition - the street parade - but this year the event has one major difference: this year the people will do the parading!

One of Melbourne's most recognisable icons, the tram, will be used for perhaps the very first time in Moomba's 46-year history, and will combine with groups of artistic performers and acts to create possibly the biggest street party the city has ever seen.

Trams On Parade will bring Swanston Street to a standstill for more than three hours as 14 trams, old and new, parade from Lonsdale Street to Flinders Street at 12 noon. The trams will stop in their tracks between Flinders and Bourke Streets. Then Melburnians are invited to take to the street and roam in and around the trams as the party gets under way.

And these are trams with a difference!

Each tram will be uniquely decorated and will feature some of Melbourne's most engaging artists. From bands and bicycles, to puppets and performers, the trams will be bursting with fun and entertainment, with plenty of interactive opportunities for all the family.

Trams on Parade will also feature an array of exciting talent through 3 stages at Bourke, Collins and Flinders Streets.

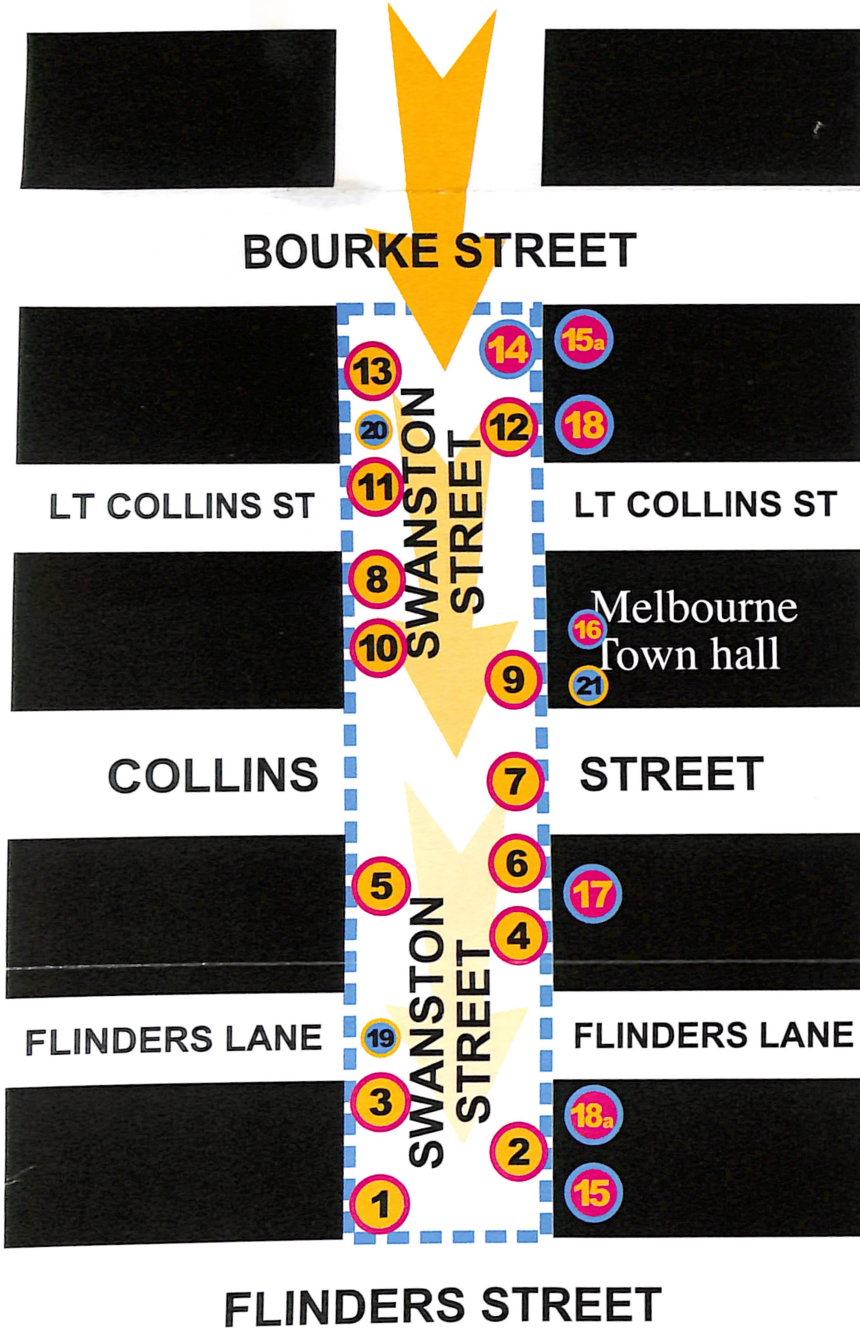

LONSDALE STREET

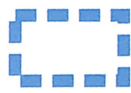
