Commuter Passes.

The easy rider.



If you're catching The Met to work every day and you don't have a Commuter Pass then you're spending too much money on your travel.

Your Commuter Pass allows you unlimited travel on any combination of trams, trains and buses within the Neighbourhoods shown on your Pass. You may select one, three, six or twelve monthly Passes. The longer the period, the greater the saving.

You can choose between three types of passes, 1. Inner Neighbourhood. 2. Any two adjoining Neighbourhoods or, 3. Anywhere in the Met system.

Free weekend travel for you and the family.

Apart from the convenience of not having to purchase your ticket every day, Commuter Passes allow you to travel free on weekends. And you can take the whole family (two adults and up to six children under 15) anywhere within The Met System.

Get the picture.

Before you purchase your Pass, you'll first have to obtain a personalised Photo Card. This will include your photo, name and address, and is valid for five years. It comes in a plastic holder into which the Commuter Pass is placed.



Both must be presented together whenever travelling.

It simply means that if your card is misplaced, nobody else will benefit from your loss.

Four steps to saving money.

1. Take a current, standard black and white or colour passport photo of yourself to any railway station. At major stations your Photo Card will be issued on-the-spot (outside peak hours), at all other stations the Photo Card will be available after 24 hours. Photo Cards can also be obtained from The Met Tram and Bus Depots, and The Met Concession Office, 673 Bourke Street.

2. Take your Photo Card with you when you buy your Commuter Pass. Passes can be purchased 3 days before the beginning of each month and travelled on from that date.

3. For a monthly Pass, present your Photo Card at any Station, Bus or Tram Depot or the Concession Office, and purchase the pass.
