Hello Warren, Brain and Mal,

As you three are my 'tramway knowledge base', I thought you might be interested in this response I received from PTV today. To confirm that route 75 is currently our longest tram route, I used the Yarra Tram feedback page with my museum email address and sent a request on October 7.

I requested their figures on the longest 4 or 5 routes in Melbourne for my article on route 75, saying the only source I could find was Wikipedia, which did not provide a reputable reference. Five days later and PTV responded with the following email with terminus to terminus lengths. I'm quite happy to accept these figures and you may wish to record them yourselves. I'm going to include a brief table of the longest 5 or 6 in a side column in the next edition.

It is interesting to compare them to the lengths on the Wikipedia page https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/List\_of\_Melbourne\_tram\_routes

Of course terminus to terminus can be longer than the passenger route which explains some of the disparity for route 75 (24.1 km v 22.8 km) and others. But the largest discrepancies appear to be 67 (by 2.9 km), 75 (by 1.3 km), then 48, 30, 12 (all 0.6km).

Do you share my confidence in the PTV figures?
