# Newsagents vow they won't sell it

NEWSAGENTS are fusing to sell the new public transport smartcard, saying the commission being offered by the State Government is so low they will lose money.

The Victorian Authorised Newsagents Association says the Transport Ticketing Au-thority is offering just 12c thority is offering just 12c commission on a transaction for the new myki card.

Under the existing Metcard arrangement newsagents re-ceive a 5 per cent commission.

Clayton Newsagency owner
Simon Richards, a thirdgeneration newsagent, said he
told the TTA he would not be
selling the ticket, despite his
long history selling Metcard.
"I won't be taking up their
offer," Mr Richards said.
"They are just making if

"They are just making it economically unviable."

Mr Richards said newsagents would lose money on the transactions if customers used debit or credit cards, which cost the retailers a fee every time they were processed.

"We get 12c a transaction, but if someone produces an Amex card, which is 3 per cent (fee), then it's just unviable.

The dispute with newsagents is the latest problem to strike the troubled smartcard, which is running 15 months

behind schedule.

Transport Ticketing Authority spokesman Bruce
Atherton said the deal being offered provided more than

commission payments.

"The new deal will include quarterly payments to retailers for being good myki ambassadors and for providing better customer service,"

Mr Atherton said.

"Some retailers will generate greater revenue selling myki than selling Metcards, some will generate less.

"More than 100 retailers have already signed up to be agents for myki."

50c, while processing a top-up on the smartcard will generate a 12c commission.

As well, a service fee of \$260 will be paid to the agents four times a year.

Opposition transport spokesman Terry Mulder said the Government had slashed newsagent commissions by up to 65 per cent.

"John Brumby is determined to ensure that newsagents are among Victorians who will pay for Labor's myki mess," Mr Mulder said.

He said newsagents would be important in ensuring that myki was easily understood by public transport users.

"Both (Public Transport Minister) Lynne Kosky and the TTA have refused to negotiate a collective agreement for newsagents with the Vic-torian Authorised News-agents Association.

"Instead, the TTA is picking off newsagents one at a time and forcing them on to commission-slashing individ-ual contracts."

Mr Atherton said news-agents were individual busi-nesses and there was no col-lective agreement in place to sell Metcard.

The TTA has signed up 7-Eleven stores to sell the card, but has no blanket agreement with newsagents.

VANA chief executive Peter Cowley said newsagents be-lieved they would lose up to 65 per cent under the proposed deal.

He said newsagents were responsible for about 50 per cent of Metcard sales.
