Nothing's safe from dogs — vet

The marauding dog situation in Warrandyte has reached desperate proportions.

"It is now almost impossible to safely keep any form of livestock in this area," local veterin-arian Dr. Howard Geldard told the Diary.

Latest victim of the dog packs is a pet donkey, which was savagely mauled in North Warrandyte.

The owners awoke to find blood gushing from a deep hole in the donkey's side and one ear almost torn off.

It survived only after ex-tensive and expensive veterinary treatment.

Not so lucky was a young pet goat, also in North Warrandyte. It was mutilated by a lone dog and had to be destroyed.

"Sheep, goats, chickens, ducks — as well as kangaroos, wallabies and other native species — have all been attacked in the Warrandyte area in recent months," Dr. Geldard said.

"The local councils are becoming more aware of the problem and I believe stif-fer penalties will be introduced.


"Something must certainly be done unless Warrandyte is to develop into a canine paradise of upturned rubbish bins and terrified farm animals."

Dr. Geldard said dog owners should make them-selves more aware of what their pets get up to at night if they are not locked inside or chained up.

"Dogs will accept being confined every night provided it is done regularly and sensibly," he said.

"This provides protection and security for the pet as well as for other animals in the neighbourhood."

Dr. Geldard said stock owners were entitled to shoot marauding animals on their properties, but because most attacks occur-red early in the morning, the culprits apprehended. were rarely



HAMER SAYS HE'LL MAKE IT HAPPEN

The final victory for North Riding conservationists is in sight.

Premier Hamer has promised Eltham Shire Council that an amendment to the Melbourne Metropolitan Planning Scheme confirm-ing the green wedge con-cept for the riding will be gazetted "very shortly".

The promise was made in a letter to shire president Robert Marshall.

The amendment would restrict subdivisions from Research-Warrandyte Road all the way through to Kinglake to a minimum 20

In some cases the minimum would be 100 acres.

An amendment applying restrictions from Warrandyte

Research was approved 2½ months ago.

"There has been a tre-mendous amount of lobby-ing to get these amend-ments through," Cr. Mar-shall told the Diary.

"The Premier's reply to my latest letter to him on the subject is the most definite and encouraging we have yet had.

"About 90 square miles of the North Riding is in-volved in the new amend-

"I think the North Rid-ing councillors will throw a party if and when the amendment goes through.

"It has been a long battle," he said.

That's the warning from Warrandyte's three fire brigades as summer and the annual bushfire hazard - approaches.

not had a serious bushfire here for several years, people tend to underestimate the danger," Warrandyte Rural danger," Warrandyte Rur Fire Brigade captain Ra Bellinger told the Diary.

"But the danger is very al and very big every summer.

"We were fortunate that weather conditions last summer were so mild, but we cannot count on always being so lucky," Capt. Bel-linger eaid. linger said.

To minimise the fire risk, the brigades urge residents who have not already cleaned up their properties to do so NOW.

Their advice:

- Get rid of all rubbish, dead grass and leaves, paper and the like from around the property.
- · Make sure your garden hoses are in good condi-tion — that you have enough of them to reach all parts of the buildings

- · Keep all spoutings, roof valleys and downpipes clear of dead leaves.
- Cover all ventilators and open eaves with fine wire mesh.
- Keep shrubs and trees well clear of walls.
- Keep the area around the house mown for a dis-tance of at least 20 ft, and keep the grass green if possible.
- Keep water storages full and preplan how to get the water out.

If there is a major fire in the area:

- Fill all available receptacles with water and place them around the house.
- Connect the garden hose ready for use.
- Block the downpipes

house and buildings. Soaked bags are quite useful for putting out grass fires.

- Keep the ladder handy for possible use later.
- any openings under the house.
- Turn off electricity and bottled gas.
- Clothe everyone adequately for protection against radiated heat.

Block gaps under the external doors.

- · As soon as the fire has • As soon as the fire has passed, go out and check for any fire, sparks or embers. If clear outside check inside the roof.
- Keep patrolling the area while danger exists.
