MOUNTING OF PRINTS FOR COMPETITIONS:

A Reminder to members

Oversize mounts are not acceptable in our Club's monthly competitions due to difficulties created in packaging and forwarding prints to the judges

While **odd size mounts are acceptable** in our Club's monthly competitions, members should be aware that for their prints to be accepted for entry in outside competitions (eg VAPS, Interclub etc), they must conform to the Competition Mounting Rules of those events. This will require remounting of odd size prints if they are to be forwarded for these outside competitions.

Prints entered in VAPS, interclub etc must conform to the competition rules for these events, which are:

Small prints must not exceed 180mm x 125 mm (7inch x 5inch) and be mounted on card up to 250mm x 200mm (10inch x 8inch) and should not exceed 5mm in thickness

Large prints must not exceed 500mm x 400mm (20inch x 16inch) and be mounted on card up to 500 x 400mm (20inch x 16inch) and should not exceed 5mm in thickness.
