## MOUNTING OF PRINTS FOR COMPETITIONS:

We are grateful to Carol Hall for the following clarification to our previous paragraph on the 'Mounting of Prints for Competitions' rules:

Prints entered in VAPS must conform to the competition rules for this event, which are:

**Small prints** must be mounted on a mat **exactly** 255mm x 200mm (10inch x 8inch), no more, no less.

**Large prints** can be mounted at any size up to 500mm x 400mm (20inch x 16inch)

Please combine the above clarification with the information in the March Newsletter to ensure you have the correct rules and regulations regarding Mounting of Prints for VAPS and other competitions.

# Material:

Corflu - size approx 24-1/4" x 17-1/2" @ \$3.50 - \$4.00 per sheet (6 sheets required). Available from General Plastic Welding, Humffray Street (south of railway crossing, next to the Tattooist). Ties – ribbon or nylon strips plus one sheet of tracing paper for creating the diffused light panel.
