VAPS Meritorious Service Award

Trina was nominated for and has recently been awarded the VAPS 30 years Meritorious Service Award

She has been an active member of the Ballarat YMCA Camera Group for 30 years. In that time, she



has served one term as President and three terms as Club Treasurer. She lectured in Basic Photography Courses conducted by the Club, was the Club's Newsletter Editor for a number of years and was responsible for setting up the Club's web page. Trina has also been a successful exhibitor in both Club and Interclub competitions.

The following snapshot gives a broader picture of Trina's participation within the club. She joined the Camera Group in 1978 and was President in 1989, Treasurer 1985-87 and 2005-2007. She was a member of the Executive Committee for 9 years. Trina won Slide of the Year for 1981, 82, 84, 87, 88 and 91. She also won the 'B Grade' Slide Award for 1979, 80, 82, 88 and 89. She won the Slides Aggregate (most points) 1980, 81, 83 and 84 and won the Black & White Print of the Year 1981 and the Aggregate for 1981 and 1982. She received Medallions for Slides 300 points, Colour Prints 150, Black & White Prints 300. In 1983 Trina won the Maryborough Golden Wattle Festival Slide Competition.

In all aspects of her involvement with the Ballarat YMCA Camera Group, she has shown outstanding leadership and commitment to photography in Ballarat and justly deserves these awards.
