VAPS MUSTER: Approximately 200 shutter bugs descended on Apollo Bay for the annual V.A.P.S. Muster on the weekend of May21st. A large percentage of these folk gathered at the Apollo bay Hotel for a pre muster dinner/get together on the Friday night.

The 45 clubs that participated produced a total of 1227 photos, 380 EDI, 156 slides, plus 24 Audio Visuals. How would you like to have to judge all of them?

These were on display in the Mechanics Institute Hall and attracted a lot of interest from the public and photographers alike. The standard of entries was high but this was not always reflected in the results due to concise scoring by the judges.

The muster activities were held at Frank Buchanan's Farm and involved presentations by Otway Tourism, and Flora and Fauna of the Apollo Bay Area by Trevor Pescott.

An Audio visual presentation of the Narbethong Fires was put together using about 400 images from the several thousand that were submitted following a photo shoot that was permitted for bonafide camera club members shortly after the fires. It is a sensitive and touching reminder of that terrible day.

Several options were available after lunch such as a trip to the lighthouse, model photography on the foreshore, and workshops on Flash Photography, Lightroom techniques, and production techniques using ProShow Gold.

The Annual Dinner and Awards Night was held back at the Barn which had now been transformed into a dining Venue.

Club members Doug Reid, Carol Townsend and Megan Rayner were awarded long service badges. These were collected on their behalf by President John Earnshaw.

Sundays Program consisted of the Presentation of the slides, followed by a fascinating talk on photographing the heavens by Peter Nelson who just happens to have an observatory in his back yard.

The next speaker failed to arrive but we were thoroughly entertained with a presentation by Bert Hoveling that even included M.R.I images of his Blocked Arteries.

The Audio Visual presentations were next on the agenda and during these, Colac Camera Club members cooked a BBQ Lunch. We were able to enjoy this in the sunshine, whilst taking in the views of those rolling Otway hills and glimpses of the ocean. We also took the opportunity chat to many of the other friendly participants. The weekend wound up with the presentation of the EDI's.

VAPS continued:

There was another opportunity to go to the lighthouse, led by a former lighthouse keeper, and timed to be there at dusk to photograph 'the light'.

Many of the weekends participants were to be found swarming all around the Marina in the hope of getting a great shot, ourselves included (but no such luck) Much discussion ensued about whether we would attempt it again at sunrise but we woke to a rather grey morning and opted out. It was a very worthwhile weekend of socialising and learning and I thoroughly recommend it to anyone who has never attended one before.

For those who wondered about Rule 2(d) which states: Slides, Projected Digital Images and Prints which have previously won awards ie. 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in the YMCA Camera Group's monthly competition cannot be re-submitted.

But, can you make a **Print** from your **Slide** and enter it in the **Small Prints** section? **Yes you can!** Can you make a **Large Print** from your **Slide** and enter it in the **Large Prints** section? **Yes you can!** The same applies to re-printing successful small prints as large prints or successful large prints as small prints or any of the above as Projected digital Images.

This is permitted because competitions for Slides, Small Prints, Large Prints and Projected Digital Images are considered to be separate competitions independent from each other.
