It was proposed by the previous committee that Rule 2(d) be changed to disallow first place winning photographs from being submitted in other monthly competitions.

This change was voted on and accepted to now read:

2(d): Projected digital images and Prints which have previously won an award, ie. First, Second, or Third in the YMCA Camera Group's monthly competition cannot be re-submitted in that category.

Any image that wins First place in the YMCA Camera Group's monthly competition is not to be entered in any other category in our club competitions.

eg.(Small print to Large print or Set subject to Open or another Set subject or to Projected digital image or vice/versa).

It is hoped that this change will keep our photography fresh and interesting and avoid the chance of the same image being selected in two different categories at external competitions.



Camera shake? A sometimes overlooked but important camera adjustment is knowing when to turn off your image stabiliser.

For those all important low light, macro, landscape type photos where you decide to use your tripod, remember to turn off the camera's (or lens) image stabiliser.
