2 Small prints

Meeting: photographs to

(Reflections)

An image of a reflection on water, windows, metal, etc, but not a reflection in a mirror.

** Prints must not exceed $180 \text{mm} \times 125 \text{mm}$ (7in $\times 5 \text{in}$), mounted on a board which must not exceed $300 \text{mm} \times 200 \text{mm}$ ($10 \text{in} \times 8 \text{in}$). Mounting thickness must not exceed 5 mm.



2 Large prints (Open)

Any subject treated pictorially, ie. Good design, arrangement and composition.

** Prints must not exceed 500mm \times 400mm (20in \times 16in) mounted on a board which must not exceed 500mm \times 400mm (20in \times 16in). Mounting thickness must not exceed 5mm.

2 Projected images (Open)

Any subject treated pictorially, ie. Good design, arrangement and composition.

- ** Images must not exceed 1920 pixels wide x 1080 pixels high.
- ** File size for each image must not exceed 5 mb. Save in JPG format.
- ** Image file names must begin with the member's code number, linked by an underscore, with the title of the image eq. 025_A Day at the Beach.jpg

Photos must be mounted with dimensions of $300mm \times 400mm$ in order to fit within the frame.

Do not use the firm cell foam backing as it will be too thick to fit within the depth of the frame.

The actual photo can be any size that will fit the above mount.

The club has cut mounts that will fit the frame and members are most welcome to use these.

In order to give all our photographers a chance for their work to be displayed it is envisaged that one photo per membe r will be displayed

on a three month rotation.

If you concentrate on the blacks (shadows) you will see one picture while if you concentrate on the whites (highlights) you will see another.





So what is more important? The answer is of course they are both equally important, both bring an important key to the makeup of an image and on any given image it really depends on what it is you want people to see.
