Bring to November 2019 Meeting:

x2 Small prints - Set Subject (Mass of Flowers)

- A photograph of an abundant show of flowers.
- ** Prints must not exceed 180mm x 125mm (7in x 5in), mounted on a board which must not exceed 250mm x 200mm (10in x 8in). Mounting thickness must not exceed 3mm.

x2 Projected images. (Open)

- Any subject treated pictorially, ie. Good design, arrangement and composition.
- ** Images must not exceed 1920 pixels wide x 1080 pixels high.
- ** File size for each image must not exceed 5mb. Save in JPG format.
- ** Image file names must begin with the member's code number, linked by an underscore, with the title of the image eg. 025_A Day at the Beach.jpg

<u>x2 Large Prints - Set Subject (Portrait)</u>

- A picture of a person or persons, which may range from a head to a full length study and which may include accessories and backgrounds in character with the subject.
- ** Prints must not exceed 500mm x 400mm (20in x 16in) mounted on a board which must not exceed 500mm x 400mm (20in x 16in). Mounting thickness must not exceed 3mm.
- For those that attended either the club camp or the club outing, don't forget to bring two small prints from Clarkesdale birdwalk and/or two small prints from the Cooriemungle weekend for judging at our November meeting.
- ** Prints must not exceed 180mm x 125mm (7in x 5in), mounted on a board which must not exceed 250mm x 200mm (10in x 8in). Mounting thickness must not exceed 3mm.

(Remember to keep image titles for all images to no more than 3 or 4 words)
