11/1 New Optus cables along streets have caused larger clearance in street tree pruning.

15/5 Notable trees locations to be provided to Maroondah Bushlinks.

8/8 Trees pamphlet to Estate agents informing of tree protection. My Dandenong planting 2500 more shrubs planted. Wetland inception project, idea from a resident Trevor Stevens. Genetically Modified foods discussed, as there is a National Forum.

5/9 Council to pay is for plants in Mt Dandenong Rd. Application for Easter Districts private nursing home, removal of 16 trees from the ridgeline. Booklet of Wildflowers some 316 to Council for pick up by visitors.

10/10 Another 400 plants into MT Dandenong rd median reserve Duncan looked in the Stationeers program. We should contact Council about the wetlands Project. Again Council wants to sell of pocket parks that are just an empty block.

14/11 Wetland meeting on site with Scott Seymour from Melbourne water. Helen Moss and Graeme Lorimer showed photos of plants in sites of biological significance. Keith Loveridge battling with Yarra water – re chemicals after kerb spraying and rain, contaminate the bay. Aerial bundling, a suggestion to levy phone calls by half a percent to get funds for aerial bundling
