WAR SOUVENIR FOR PRIME MINISTER



Central Press Canadian An ash tray made from the casing of the first shell fired by the Canadian forces in the Korean war is presented to Prime Minister Louis St. Laurent, at the House of Commons by Vice-Admiral E. R. Mainguy, chief of the naval staff, on behalf of the Royal Canadian navy. The shell from which the ash tray was made was fired August 15, 1950, by HMCS Cayuga, then commanded by Captain Jeffry Brock of Winnipeg. Three Canadian destroyers, the Cayuga, Sioux and Athabaskan were despatched to the Far East on July 5, 1950, and within a month were serving in Korean waters under United Nations command.

More than one third of Canadian aluminum production, used domestically, finds its way into the construction trade.
